STRATEGY STATEMENT

- Our priorities for catch up are phonics, reading and writing. Pupils do less well in these subjects under normal conditions and have fallen further behind due to the school closure.
- The main strategy is to provide additional teaching support for individuals and small groups in phonics, reading and writing.
- The overall aims of our catch-up premium strategy are
 - To reduce the attainment gap between our disadvantaged pupils and their peers
 - To raise the attainment of all pupils to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures

Reading and writing were also identified as an area where progress is too low. Maths results were much better across the school and gaps in knowledge and skills can be met by increasing the allocated time by 30 mins/day at no cost.
