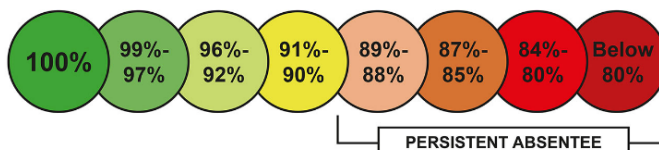

The Government is committed to tackling the issues that might cause some children to miss school unnecessarily

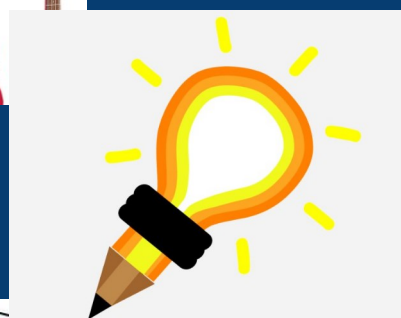
How does attendance affect outcomes for pupils?

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best results.

The data also shows that in 2019, primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.

SATs: Standard Assessment Tests.

SATS are government required tests taken at the end of year two and then of year six. At the end of year two children are tested on the Maths, English and science syllabus for Key Stage One so these are called KS1 SATS. At the end of year six children are tested on the Maths, English and SPaG syllabus for Key Stage Two so these are called KS2 SATS.
